Subject: EU Council Regulation 833/2014 Article 3g (1) d

The EU Council Regulation 833/2014 is a regulation that imposes restrictive measures on Russia in response to its actions in Ukraine. Article 3g was further amended in COUNCIL REGULATION (EU) 2023/1214 of 23 June 2023 to prohibit the purchase, import or transfer, directly or indirectly the goods listed in Annexes XVII if they originate in Russia.

Corrosion Materials has audited our supply chain and has had all regular suppliers respond to this matter. Our suppliers have confirmed that no Russian originating material will be used for new production of metal products sold to Corrosion Materials.

Earlier in the year we have updated our conflict minerals reporting template to reflect that smelters from the Russian Federation have been removed from our supply chain for materials containing tungsten, titanium, tin and gold. The extended material reporting template for cobalt and mica has also been updated to reflect the removal of material originating from Russian smelters.

With these updates, we can confirm that we are following the amended regulation for corrosion resistant alloy products stocked by Corrosion Materials from this point forward.
